A Little Extra.

- **Grow A Little Extra** is a partnership with the University of Wyoming Extension's Cent\$ible Nutrition Program (CNP) and Master Gardener Program, encouraging community organizations and individuals to grow extra produce for neighbors facing food insecurity.
- Increased access to fresh produce in Wyoming is a critical tool in the fight against food insecurity. **Grow A Little Extra** is helping to remove existing barriers one vegetable at a time. Join the fight!
- **County fair horticulture exhibitors** are joining the fight to end hunger statewide. Once their produce has been judged, a single item is kept for display, and the rest is collected and donated to local food pantries before it goes bad.

Logistics Overview

Day of Produce Judging: Volunteers will be present with special "Hunger Hero Ribbons."

At Check-in: Families entering judged produce will be invited to participate. If they agree, they will receive a ribbon to attach to their entry.

After Judging: With permission marked clearly, a Wyoming Hunger Initiative representative will collect all but one of the judged items, leaving one for display.

Packaging: Items will be gently gathered into ziplocks, bags, or egg cartons.

Delivery: Everything will go straight to a hunger relief organization in your community and be distributed to local families that same week.

How can you help?

- 1) Grow beautiful produce to be judged at your local county fair.
 - 2) Present your harvest to the judges.
 - 3) Indicate that you would like to donate your produce to a local hunger relief partner - everything will be donated and distributed to local families that same week.
 - 4) Receive a Hunger Hero ribbon to be displayed all week at fair!
